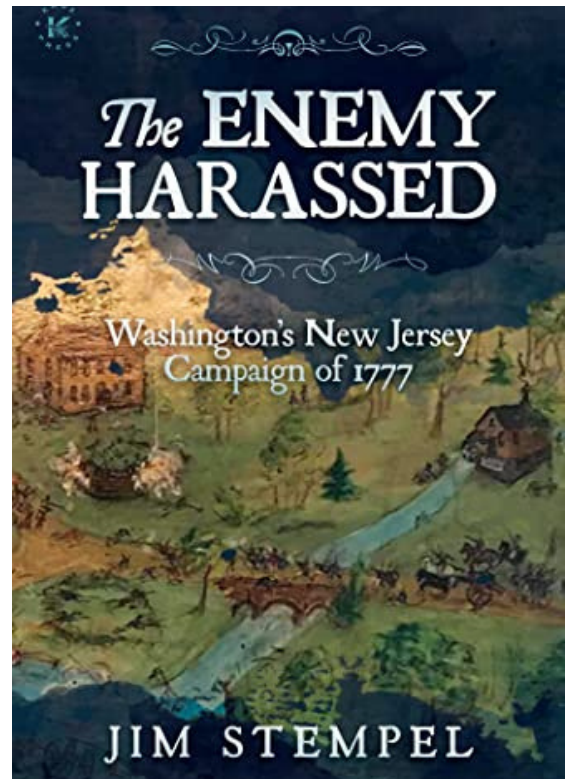

NEW ACQUISITION

This textile fragment is Indian chintz fabric which was popular in the colonies during the 18th century. This fabric was designed, dyed, and painted by hand and durable enough for washing. Colonists prized chintz fabric for these remarkable qualities. When the first Continental Congress voted to boycott British imports, chintz fabrics were included and inspired colonists to produce homespun alternatives. This chintz fragment is a great example of the international trade conducted by the East India Trading Company and the impact of imported goods in the American Revolution.
