

## American Flag Windsock

This simple patriotic activity is a great way to discover the parts of the American flag and their meanings. Every day is a good day to fly your flag. Special dates to consider: November 11-Veteran's Day, June 14 -Flag Day or July 4 - Independence Day!

Suggested for ages 4-12 Length of time: 20 minutes

## Supplies Needed:

Blue construction paper (two pieces taped together on the 9" sides)

Red and white paper streamers (cut to about 18 inches)
13 white stars, cut with star-shaped die cutter out of white copy
paper

3 pieces of string or twine (cut in about 12-inch pieces) One-hole punch Scotch tape Glue stick

Scissors



- 1. Tape the blue construction paper together on the short end (9" side)
- 2. Glue 13 stars in their preferred pattern across the blue paper
- 3. Flip the construction paper over so that the stars are now on the back side



- 4. Tape the streamers in a red/white/red/white pattern across the bottom of the blue paper until the bottom of the paper is full (approximately 4-5 of each color)
- 5. Flip the construction paper over so that the streamers are now on the back side
- 6. Tape the blue paper ends together so that it forms a cylinder.
- 7. Using the hole punch, punch 3 holes equidistance from one another on the top of the blue paper
- 8. Using three pieces of twine, tie one end of each to the holes in the blue paper. Then tie the tops of each piece of twine together at the top.
