Joseph Haven's Leather Fire Bucket
c.1793

Joseph Haven was a founding member of the Federal Fire Society in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Like many 18th century firefighters, Joseph was a volunteer and maintained this bucket to throw sand or water on a blaze. While his grandfather and father (both SAR Patriots) supported the Revolution, as a firefighter Joseph may have been exempt from service.
