THE 1823 STONE DECLARATION

America's Founding—Faithfully Preserved

See a rare 1823 William Stone engraving of the Declaration of Independence—the first exact facsimile of the original 1776 document—now on public display at the Sons of the American Revolution Genealogical Research Library in downtown Louisville. Commissioned by John Quincy Adams, this historic engraving became the definitive image of the Declaration for generations of Americans.

NEW ACQUISITION

Daniel Boone Signed Document
1782

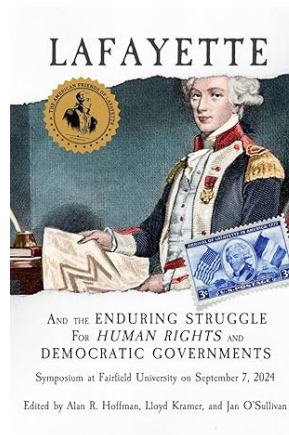
Daniel Boone certifies the ownership of a horse, owned by Samuel Kelly. The horse was used during an expedition against the Shawnee led by George Rogers Clark in November 1782. Lasting 28 days, this was the last major campaign of the Revolutionary War and was a retaliation against the Native Americans after the Battle of Blue Licks which occurred in August of that same year.

I do certify that I have the Property of Samuel Kelly now in Public Service for the Use of my Company of Fayette Militia on the late Expedition against the Shawnee Commanded by Br. Gen. Clarke from the 24th Day of Oct^r until the 28th Day of Nov^r 1782 Inclusive about 28 Days
Capt. Wm. McConnell of Lexington opened before me and was careful and fully sworn that the horse horses above mentioned was in his Company in publick service the time that is mentioned
December 28. 1782

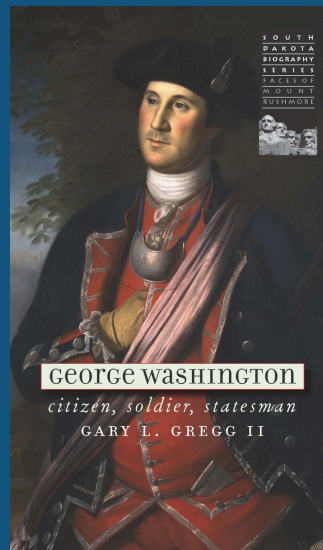
REVOLUTIONARY WAR RARITIES PODCAST
